
This is a critical time for climate action! While the world prepares for COP26, the need for urgent action globally to curb CO2 emissions has never been so clear. ClimateFast is committed to pushing our newly elected federal government to take bold action immediately to cut carbon emissions and to plan a just transition to a low carbon future. We also need to see climate leadership at the provincial level, and ClimateFast will be teaming up with other climate action organizations to ensure climate is a key focus in the next provincial election on June 2, 2022.

CALLS TO ACTION

The People's Summit for Climate Justice

The COP 26 meetings in Glasgow, Scotland, are the latest round of international meetings set in motion more than 30 years ago to solve the Climate Crisis. Despite all the conferences and reports that this process has produced and the agreements that have been entered into, carbon emissions have continued to rise globally. The people that bear the least responsibility for the Climate Crisis are bearing the brunt: BIPOC peoples, pacific-islanders, and climate refugees fleeing drought, fire, and flood.

The [COP26 Coalition](#) is organizing decentralized mass mobilizations across the world to build power for system change – from indigenous struggles to trade unions, from racial justice groups to youth strikers. Between Nov 7th to 10th, there will be over 200 sessions bringing together the climate justice movement to discuss, learn, and strategize for system change. Here in Toronto, a newly formed coalition of labour, climate, and social justice groups has been organizing to hold an action around more Canada-specific demands:

- Respect Indigenous sovereignty
- Phase out fossil fuels
- Just transition for communities and workers
- Global Justice



The Toronto Transit Commission (TTC) is creating a new fare plan and will be debating about the future of fares at its November 17th meeting. [TTCriders](#) is campaigning for free TTC fares for high school students. This is a racial justice, equity, and climate issue. Kingston instituted this and ridership shot up from 28,000 to 600,000!


