On Feb. 8th, MP Niki Ashton (NDP, Churchill–Keewatinook Aski) tabled Private Members' Bill C-245 (An act to Amend the Canada Infrastructure Bank Act). This bill will allow Canada to leverage public ownership and public investment in the fight against climate change and in support of the most marginalized communities in Canada. The bill is currently at second reading in the House of Commons. Support Bill C-245.

Join the May 7 rally to demand better transit in Scarborough!

Saturday, May 7th, 2:00pm - 3:30pm Scarborough Civic Centre (Albert Campbell Square)

For over 30 years Scarborough has been neglected on transit. The Scarborough RT (Line 3) will be closed in 2023, but a subway replacement won't open until 2030. That means at least 7 years of replacement buses for 35,000 transit users connecting between Kennedy Station and Scarborough Town Centre.

Community and youth leaders will give speeches in English, Mandarin, Bangla, and Tamil about the transit solutions that Scarborough needs, and there will be live music performances! The Scarborough Civic Centre will be open and washrooms available
